 - SP Has a list of funding stream, but we need to provide a scenario in which we need funding for – SP to do some pre-research
- With the civil engineer looking into club, would there be any risk of club subsidence?

- Funding
 - SP Theres lots available:
 - British rowing
 - English Rowing Society

- SB would a floating landing stage be a good alternative?
 - CB the trouble is we don't have that much room and if we were to have a ramp to a floating landing stage it would be very steep. Also, they're not very wide
